PRESENTATIONS

1. Texas Municipal Clerk's Achievement of Excellence Award.

Mayor Brundrett recognized City Manager Tom Muir, who invited Amanda Campos, City Secretary for the City of Burleson and past TMCA President, to present the 2023 Municipal Clerk's Achievement of Excellence Award to Azle's City Secretary, Yael Forgey. This is the second time the award has been presented to Azle's Municipal Clerk's office. Mayor Brundrett congratulated Ms. Forgey on this achievement.

3. Consider any action on Resolution No. 2023-07 designating the *Tri-County Reporter* as the official newspaper.

Councilmember Conner moved to approve Resolution No. 2023-07 designating the *Tri-County Reporter* as the official newspaper for the City of Azle. Councilmember Peek seconded the motion.

4. Consider any action authorizing the City Manager to execute an interlocal agreement with the City of Pelican Bay for police dispatch and detention services.

Mayor Alan Brundrett introduced Police Chief Ben Hall, who advised the City of Pelican Bay requested the Azle Police Department provide dispatch services as their contracted provider (City of Sansom Park) gave notice of their intent to end service. The ILA provides that the City of Azle will provide for magistrate, arraignment, police dispatch, holding facility use, and warrant services as the City of Pelican Bay does not possess the staffing for such services. The agreement is for a one-year term with an annual renewal option.

Councilmember Conner moved to authorize the City Manager to execute an interlocal agreement with the City of Pelican Bay for police dispatch and detention services, effective June 28, 2023. Mayor Pro Tem Goode seconded the motion.

5. Conduct a public hearing and take any action on Ordinance No. 2023-07 regarding the 2023 Roadway System Impact Fee Study, Land Use Assumptions, Roadway System Capital Improvements Plans, and the Roadway Impact Fee Rates.

Mayor Brundrett introduced Nick Kirk, Jacob and Martin LLC, who gave a presentation on the Roadway System Impact Fee study.
